Rameswaram temple precinct gets a clean-up

Chennai: A trip to Rameswaram, a famous pilgrim destination on Tamil Nadu's southeastern coast, is usually a memorable one. The Pamban bridge, which connects the island to mainland, the rows of fishing boats bobbing near the shore and the village on the edge of the sea present a breathtaking picture. But, as tourists near the Rameswaram temple, they are assailed by an unbearable stench.

The garbage heaps makes it one of the worst-maintained pilgrim destinations in the state. With no government effort for the coming to spruce up the area which attracts thousands of pilgrims every day, Vivekananda Kendra, a Kanyakumari-based NGO has launched an initiative to clean up the temple town.

While hordes of pilgrims visit TN for its temples, local municipalities pay little attention to conservancy and hygiene. Rameswaram's seafront is littered with garbage generated from rituals, and the temple premises are in need of an elaborate sprucing up.

For the Kendra volunteers, it has proved a huge challenge. While removing garbage from the wells, they even found empty liquor bottles. Inspired by the volunteers' commitment, locals have joined in.

"We took up this project as a tribute to Swami Vivekananda on his 150th birth anniversary, celebrated in February," Kendra secretary G Vasudeo told TOL "We start-

ed with 10 volunteers. After a while, many locals joined us. Now, they are cleaning several wells, some of which even the locals are not aware of. Funds are a problem, which is delaying our project. But, we are collecting donations," he said.

collector District Nanthkumar said the administration had teamed up with Kendra volunteers in the clean-up mission. "The administration will appoint several more people to collect garbage from houses. We have issued tenders for this," he said. With the wells being cleaned up and restored, they are being used by locals for day-to-day use and ritu-Besides getting scrubbed look, the temple clean-up is also creating an awareness among the locals about the available water resources as well as the town's heritage value.
