2. Water Management

This financial year we have Revived and Renovated two Traditional water bodies - Teppakulam and Chidamabara Teerthams. The work is carried out by Vivekananda Kendra - Nardep, Kanyakumari.

5. Eco-tourism & Green Transport

District administration is not allowing the regular four wheelers and tempos etc. to operate in the four Sannathi streets because of heavy traffic of pedestrians. However for the benefit of elders and sick people, they allow E-autos. For the last several years, we are plying six e-autos with a nominal fees of Rs.10/- per person. This service is very popular among the pilgrims. In addition it gives livelihood to the auto drivers by operating eco friendly vehicles.

In an emergency, the auto drivers also take care of the sick patients and in an emergency admit them in the nearby government hospital. In the year 2024 - 25 we provided service to more than one and half lakhs pilgrims. The details are given below:
